Program and Achievement during 2016- 17

1. Awareness drives on energy conservation:

Energy Conservation Campaign

While observing the "International Energy day" on 03.05.2016, An Awareness drive was launched at community level inviting the people and pry-members. The pamphlets on energy conservation in English, Hindi and Urdu languages were distributed among the community people on following concept. Energy is essential to life and key to human progress. Its conservation is essential to Modern Industrial Societies. As the population in our country grows and pace of urbanization increases, energy use is bound to increase. At present India is the fifth largest consumer of energy in the world.

Energy Conservation is a Practice for

2. Conservation of Biodiversity:

Since Bio-diversity implies 3 basic concepts -genetic, species and ecosystem which provides effective instrumentality upon the rural poor in their sustainable livelihood, conservation of biodiversity is proved inhabitable among villagers. It is a fact of the biodiversity is threatened chiefly

is due to population growth, industrialization, excessive resource demand, introduction of exotic species, atmospheric pollutants etc. Erosion of biodiversity is due to socio-economic change of human society on following causal factors:

- Unsustainable production and consumption pattern.
- Human population growth.
- Globalization of trade
- Poverty
- Land use policies
- Poor governance
- Ineffective intersectional co-ordinations.
- Fragmented decision making.
- Loss of cultural identity and spiritual value.
- Insufficient scientific and implementation situation.
- Limited use of scientific and local knowledge.
- Poor understanding about role of biodiversity.

3. Environmental Protection :

(a) Pollution abatement and control :

Organisation undertakes activities to reduce levels of pollution and promote clean air, clean water, reducing and preventing noise pollution, radiation control, solid waste management and recycling programs.

(b) Natural resources conservation and protection :

Conservation and preservation of natural resources, including land, water, energy and plant resources for the general use and enjoyment of the public.

Organisation runs public awareness campaigns about how to conserve energy.

(c) Go Wild for Life :

The community people were mobilized towards the plantation. All necessary activities like procurement of saplings, land preparation, fencing etc. were completed with the help of Members & community people.

6. Education :

Savera Literacy Campaign :

Organisation launched Literacy Campaign on the eve of 50th anniversary of International Literacy Day, 8th September 2016 aiming to aware community people about the literacy and its benefits. Thousands of people involved in the campaign.

After campaigning program, free literacy kit distributed among poor and needy people and organisation launched "Savera Literacy Project " with a vision to Literate India for all. Our Organisation is committed to to cover all aspects of education. It has been entrusted to participate in the Global Education 2030 Agenda.

Savera Literacy Project :

There are 758 million adults 15 years and older are still illiterate in the world.

The target is that by 2030 youth and substantial Proportion of adults, both men and Women achieve literacy and numeracy.

Our Mission is to eradicate illiteracy, Poverty and drive Sustainable development.

Goal : To ensure inclusive and equitable quality education and promote lifelong learning opportunities for all.

Literacy is a fundamental human right and the foundation for lifelong learning. It is fully essential to social and human development in its ability to transform lives.

Literacy helps eradicate poverty, reduce child mortality, curb population growth, achieve gender equality and ensure sustainable development, peace and democracy.

Project Description :

Literacy rate of India is 72.1 % below average world's literacy rate 86.3% as indicated by UNESCO Institute for Statistics(UIS) data 2015. Almost world's half illiterate population lives in India and two-third of them are female.

India's largest population state, Uttar Pradesh having nearly 200 million population and 67.68% literacy rate which is below average national literacy rate 74.04 % as of 2011 census.

There are 72 Districts, 821 Blocks and 106,773 Villages in Uttar Pradesh. Our aim is to establish a Literacy Center in each block, but in the first phase of program, focus is on 35 blocks of 4 districts (Hapur, Ghaziabad, Bulandshahr, and Meerut) in Uttar Pradesh where literacy rate is below State /National literacy rate.

7. Awareness drives on AIDS:

While observing the "world AIDS day" on 01.12.2016, An Awareness drive was launched in Slum areas in order to awaken the Community people about AIDS, as if AIDS remains one of the world's most significant health challenges, particularly in low & middle-income countries. Campaigning was carried out by different means with pamphlets, banners & posters etc.

8. Human Rights:

Seminar:

Venue: Office premises, Hapur

While observing the "world Human Rights day" on 10-12-2016, a seminar on Human Rights was organized by the organization, in order to aware the community people about fundamental Rights & Duties of every individual guaranteed under Indian Constitution.

Human Rights Day is observed every year on 10 December. It commemorates the day on which, in 1948, the United Nations General Assembly adopted the Universal Declaration of Human Rights. In 1950, the Assembly passed resolution 423 (V), inviting all States and interested organizations to observe 10 December of each year as Human Rights Day.

"Our Rights. Our Freedoms. Always." aims to promote and raise awareness of the two Covenants on their 50th anniversary. The year-long campaign revolves around the theme of rights and freedoms - - freedom of speech, freedom of worship, freedom from want, and freedom from fear -- which underpin the International Bill of Human Rights are as relevant today as they were when the Covenants were adopted 50 years ago.

9. Youth Motivation drives:

Indian Government declared J anuary 12th as the National Youth Day in 1984. This day marks the birthday of great Indian philosopher, Swami Vivekananda whose teachings are the biggest philosophical asset of the country. The motto of declaring youth day on the birth date of this philosophical guru was motivating and inculcating these pious ideals to the coming generations.

Swami Vivekananda's birthday on J anuary 12 is always celebrated as National Youth Day and the week commencing from that day is known as the National Youth Week. As part of National Youth Week celebrations, the Government of India holds the National Youth Festival every year. This is an event of the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports, Government of India and is celebrated annually in one of the States in a joint venture. The youth festival aims to propagate the concept of national integration, spirit of communal harmony, brotherhood, courage and adventure amongst the youth by exhibiting their cultural prowess in a common platform. This is done by organizing gatherings of

youth across the country and encouraging them to take part in different activities.

10. Leprosy Eradication and Rehabilitation drives:

Leprosy Eradication Campaign :

While observing "World Leprosy Eradication Day" on 30th Jan, 2017, An awareness campaign to eradicate Leprosy was initiated through Pamphlets, banners & posters etc.

Rehabilitation drive :

Organisational work is broad and far -reaching. The combination of a disease that has a severely debilitating effect on the body and the stigma surrounding it means a unique and holistic approach is required to care for a person's need. We focus on the physical, social and psychological needs of a leprosy -affected persons and our steadfast support proves to be the bedrock upon which thousands of people have grown to depend.

11. Social Justice Conference:

Topic: Social Justice & Social Equality

Venue: Institute of Management and Information Technology, Hapur

While observing the "world day of Social justice" on 20.02.2017, A Social Justice Conference organized by the Society inviting the community people and pry- members. The objective behind the program was to inform the community people about the Spirit of Social Justice.

Justice :

The term 'justice' in the Preamble embraces three distinct forms- social, economic and political, secured through various provisions of Fundamental Rights and Directive Principles. Social justice denotes the equal treatment of all citizens without any social distinction based on caste, colour, race, religion, sex and so on. It means absence of privileges being extended to any particular section of the society, and improvement in the conditions of backward classes (SCs, STs, and OBCs) and women. Economic justice denotes on the non- discrimination between people on the basis of economic factors. It involves the elimination of glaring inequalities in wealth, income and property. A combination of social justice and economic justice denotes what is known as 'distributive justice'. Political justice implies that all citizens should have equal political rights, equal voice in the government.

Equality :

The term 'equality' means the absence of special privileges to any section of the society, and

provision of adequate opportunities for all individuals without any discrimination. The Preamble secures at all citizens of India equality of status and opportunity. This provision embraces three dimensions of equality- civic, political and economic.

The following provisions of the chapter on Fundamental Rights ensure civic equality:

- a) Equality before the Law (Article 14).
- b) Prohibition of discrimination on grounds of religion, race, caste, sex or place of birth (Article 15).
- c) Equality of opportunity in matters of public employment (Article 16).
- d) Abolition of untouchability (Article 17).
- e) Abolition of titles (Article 18).

12. Awareness drive on Consumer Rights:

While observing the "World Consumer Rights day on 15.03.2017, An Awareness Campaign was launched at I.M.I.T. College in order to aware the students about their Consumer Rights.

Know your Consumer Rights

In order to safeguard consumer interest, eight consumer rights are defined by UN Consumer Bill of Rights:

- 1- Right to Safety - safeguarding against goods that are hazardous to life and property.
- 2- Right to Information - consumers have the right to be informed regarding the price, quality, quantity, etc., of the products they buy.
- 3- Right to Choice - consumers should be provided with a wide variety of goods to choose from.
- 4- Right to be Heard - the right of consumers to have their complaints heard.
- 5- Right to Satisfaction of Basic Needs - this right demands that people have access to basic, essential goods and services: adequate food, clothing, shelter, health care, education, public utilities, water, and sanitation.
- 6- Right to Redress - consumers have the right to seek redress regarding their complaints.
- 7- Right to Consumer Education - the right of consumers to be educated about their rights.
- 8- Right to a Healthy Environment - this is the right to live and work in an environment that is non-threatening to the well-being of present and future generations.
