Annual Report 2013-14

Program and Achievement during 2013-14

Contextual overview:

The organization has never lagged behind for the implementation of welfare activities in the sphere of women empowerment, health, education, environment, devolvement of child/ Youth / adolescent & rural area etc. However the dossier all activities were approved by the general body of "Savera Society for Human Initiatives".

1. Rural development:

Venue: IMIT Campus, Hapur

An awareness meeting was held on 17-05-2013, inviting the people, pry members, Nagar Palika Members & Gram Pradhans, aiming to ask for the proposals for the development of minority concentrated villages of district, Hapur under "Multi Sectoral District Development Plan". As per the proposals a memorandum for the development of rural areas was handed over to the D.M. Hapur.

In order to create opportunities for self-employment and job placement, in favor of unemployed youth, specifically that minority community, this training was organized at a rented building. The Inspection was invited having good track records of educational qualification and experience. Computer and other accessories for learning were provided by the organization from its own resources.

2. Eco-development program:

(a) Saplings:

In order to recoup the loss of greeneries in community surroundings massive plantation in community lands and schools campus and barren fields was felt necessities for which pro-environment activities were initiated by the organization while observing "World Environment Day" on 05-06-2013. The community people were mobilized towards the plantation. All necessary activities like procurement of saplings, land preparation, fencing etc. were completed with the help of Members & community people.

3. Sincere Condolence & Compassion:

A Condolence meeting was held on 23-06-2013, for the peace of spirits of people died in natural disaster in Uttarakhand.

A cheque of Rs.5100/- dated 08-07-2013 was sent to the C.M's Relief fund, Uttarakhand, to compassionate the victims of natural disaster.

(4) Race & Art Competition:

While observing the "Children's day" on 14-11-2013, A race competition was organized for the school going students to encourage them towards sports.

An Art competition was organized on the same day for the girls students. At the end of program, prizes & Certificates were distributed among all the students.

(5) Awareness drives on AIDS:

While observing the world AIDS day on 01.12.2013, An Awareness Rally was organized in Slum areas in order to awaken the Community people about AIDS, as if AIDS remains one of the world's most significant health challenges, particularly in low & middle-income countries.

Campaigning was carried out with pamphlets, banners & posters etc.

(6) Conservation of Bio-diversity:

Seminar:

Venue: IMIT Campus, Hapur

While observing "International Biodiversity Day" on 29-12-2013 a seminar on Biodiversity conservation was organized by the organization, in order to aware the community people about Biodiversity & its Conservation.

Since Bio-diversity implies 3 basic concepts -genetic, species and ecosystem which provides effective instrumentality upon the rural poor in their sustainable livelihood, conservation of bio-diversity is proved inhabitable among villagers. It is a fact of the bio-diversity is threaten chiefly is due to population growth, industrialization, excessive resource demand, introduction of exotic species, atmospheric pollutants etc. Erosion of bio-diversity is due to socio-economic change of human society on following causal factors:

- Unsustainable production and consumption pattern.
- Human population growth.
- Globalization of trade
- Poverty
- Land use policies
- Poor governance
- Ineffective intersectional co-ordinations.
- Fragmented decision making.
- Loss of cultural identity and spiritual value.
- Insufficient scientific and implementation situation.
- Limited use of scientific and local knowledge.
- Poor understanding about role of bio-diversity.

During the convention on biological diversity in 1992, the genetic resources and traditional knowledge were often taken from community people by NGO's. Now the biodiversity conservation has been proved a spectacular form the small/marginal farmers who are now on continuing loss of agriculture outcome. Hence the maintenance of agro bio-diversity is essential on their part to adopt bio-fertilizers & pesticides instead of chemicals and the resource person have highlighted the process of maintenance of agro-bio-diversity. Which was file appreciated by the poor farmers.

(7)Visit at Leprosy Colony:

Compassion:

No. of Families: 35

A team of Organization visited Leprosy Colony on 14-01-2014, to note down the various problems faced by Leprosy affected people. Team members submitted a Survey Report indicating the following problems.

1. No supply of medicine since 2011.
2. Lack of Foodstuffs.
3. Lack of woolen cloths, Blankets, etc.

A memorandum was handed over to the D.M. Hapur, for immediate supply of Medicine(MDT).

While observing "World Leprosy Eradication Day" on 30-01-2014, Foodstuffs estimated amount Rs.19,222/- were distributed among the Leprosy affected people as well as an awareness campaign to eradicate Leprosy was initiated through Pamphlets, banners & posters etc.

(8) Awareness drives on consumer welfare:

While observing the world consumer welfare day on 15.03.2014, An Awareness meeting was held at community level inviting the villagers and pry-members. The viable concept on consumer's requirement was provided to the community people on following concept.

- Price like of essential commodities.
- Consumer's rights to refer the district level & state level authority against unholy traders.
- Nexus between middle person & traders.
- Quality of commodities through laboratory test.
- Viability & feasibility off opening a fare price shop on co-operative basis.
